#### Richard (Dick) McLean

The Board of Selectmen has chosen to honor and dedicate the annual Town Report to Richard (Dick) McLean. Dick served as a Town Selectman from 1998 to 2011. In addition to his service on the Board of Selectmen and as Chair of the Board, Dick has served the Town as a member of the Comprehensive Plan Committee, the Waterfront Committee, the Downtown Flood Resiliency Committee, the Midcoast Economic Development District General Assembly, and the Budget Committee. Dick and his wife Pat, a Cemetery Trustee, contribute on an ongoing basis to the care of cemeteries. One of Dick's specialties is the restoration of markers on all of the veterans' graves in town. He is one of two volunteers who assist Rob Gregory in the winding of the Town Clock located in the steeple of the Baptist Church. Dick has been a treasure trove of information for Town Manager Matt Lutkus, a role that was especially appreciated during Matt's first years in Damariscotta.

Dick joined the Lincoln County Economic Development Office Advisory Board in 2008, representing Damariscotta. He recognized the need for a stronger voice and greater capacity for Lincoln County communities, and was instrumental in creating the LC Regional Planning Commission in 2010 which combined economic development, land use and transportation planning services and expanded local participation in County activities. He led the RPC through the first five years as President, and currently serves as Treasurer.

Dick serves on the Board of Midcoast Community Action, and served previously as Board President.

In the last couple years, he also has committed himself to strengthening the resources and programs of Lincoln County Dental. LC Dental is a non-profit dental clinic run by volunteers which provides access to dental care to individuals who are at or below 200% of the federal poverty line and have no dental home.

He's also active as an Ambassador for Friends of MidCoast Maine, a grass-roots group which helps communities protect their natural and cultural legacy, while planning for healthy growth.

Dick and Pat will be celebrating their fiftieth wedding anniversary in August. They have two sons, two daughters-in law, and two grandsons.

#### **Board of Selectmen Annual Report**

Greetings to the Citizens of Damariscotta,

On behalf of the Board of Selectmen, it is my privilege and pleasure to inform you of the progress the Board, Town Staff, various committees and numerous volunteers have made during this past year. First, however, I would like to thank my fellow Board members for their dedication to their many activities undertaken this past year, and for the hard work and positive attitude of the Town's staff—the face of Damariscotta for the residents and visitors alike. A special thank you goes to outgoing Selectman Jim Cosgrove, who decided not to run for reelection this term. His contributions to the Board and our meetings are immeasurable, and he will be missed.

As in past years, the Selectmen updated the Town's Action Plan at the beginning of the fiscal year, revising activities based on past actions and current needs. In the past several years, the Town has accomplished all priority events on the Action Plan, and this year is no exception. The Town also continued to fund its Capital Improvement Plan to address current and future needs. These planning tools continue to guide the work of the Board and Town Staff.

The Town has made progress on many fronts during the last year. First and foremost, the Public Works Committee completed its assessment of all of Damariscotta's roadways, and developed a five-year maintenance plan. Using the plan, this past year has seen wide-ranging activities in roadway improvements throughout the Town, with more scheduled into the late autumn. Because of this detailed assessment of our infrastructure needs by this dedicated committee, Damariscotta is realizing improvements in a timely and low cost manner. Unfortunately however, although the Federal Grant application for the Bristol Road Sidewalk project was approved in 2013, various administrative issues have caused sidewalk and roadway improvements to be delayed yet another year.

New and exciting developments have taken place on the Town's waterfront plan this year. Damariscotta's Town Manager Matt Lutkus has been hard at work gaining interest and support for implementing the Waterfront Committee's recommendations. In partnership with the Twin Villages Alliance, the Town has received several significant donations to make improvements to the municipal parking lot. Waterfront Park has been repaired and improvements made prior to the start of the busy summer season. Donations also have been accepted for additional benches and a picnic seating area which many have been enjoying this past year. Donations for public restrooms have been received and, when combined with funding set aside in the Capital Improvement Plan, work on that project will begin this year. The Town thanks all those who donated funds to the municipal parking lot and Waterfront Park. Without the generosity of these individuals, none of the work that has been done would have been completed this year. While funding for the flood resiliency project has not been forthcoming, the current improvements will greatly enhance the waterfront area for the enjoyment of residents and visitors for the coming years.

As a result of concerns expressed by Damariscotta residents this past year, the Police Department increased attention to the problem of speeding in several areas of the Town. In addition, it purchased variable message boards to inform drivers of their speed in an effort to keep speeds within safe limits when enforcement activities were not taking place. In response to concerns expressed, the Maine Department of Transportation conducted a speed survey on Bristol Road and as a result, has agreed to lower the speed limit on a portion of the roadway.

As a designated Regional Service Center town, serving surrounding towns through its businesses, Miles Hospital, and Great Salt Bay School, Damariscotta enjoys a robust business center, serving an estimated 12,500 in central Lincoln County. We are fortunate that there are

rarely empty storefronts in the Village. This year the Town is seeing new growth in business beyond the Village, with several new developments in the planning stages. Additionally, several new residential areas have been approved for development, demonstrating the continued economic viability of living and working in Damariscotta. To plan for growth consistent with the values of the residents of Damariscotta, the Town is working with the Rotary Club, Twin Villages Alliance, the Chamber of Commerce and others on a business forum to be conducted in the autumn. The Board will continue to encourage businesses to locate in Damariscotta to provide both services and employment opportunities to its residents.

The Town has been updating its website this past year to provide additional information to users in a more customer-friendly format, including the ability to download and complete forms on line. The new website will also be updated more frequently, keeping Damariscottians and those wishing to visit or relocate here more current with Town activities.

The Board of Selectmen thanks you, the residents of Damariscotta, for all of your input and insights during this past year. It is only through your interest in keeping the Town informed of your concerns and your support that we are able to address the community's needs.

#### **Town Clerk's Office**

This year is my first year as your Town Clerk and I am honored to be working for the Town of Damariscotta. We have had a new addition to our office staff. Becky Bartolotta joined our team in February. Becky has previous experience working for our town and has been a great asset!

The Town Clerk's office is responsible for recording and preservation of vital records such as births, marriages, and deaths. Issuing certified copies of these records along with making corrections, additions, and deletions are all completed by the Town Clerk's Office in accordance with the State of Maine Office of Vital Records. We have been utilizing the Electronic Death Registration System (EDRS) and Electronic Birth Registration System (EBRS) for our 4<sup>th</sup> year now and marriages are currently being implemented into this same system. These systems store all vital records electronically and has eliminated much of the need to store paper copies of such records in our town vault.

The Clerk's office is responsible for issuing licenses such as dog or hunting and/or fishing, etc. Also, under the responsibility of the Clerk's office is holding and supervising all state and municipal elections. Elections are held in the Municipal Building at 21 School St., with polling hours from 8:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. These elections and annual and/or special town meetings could not happen without the generous help of our dedicated Damariscotta residents. I continue to call on the same community members time and time again, and they continue to assist us in maintaining the election process. I would like to **THANK YOU** all for continuing to support the elections and town meeting processes time and time again. You are the ones who make the elections possible! <u>Marriage Licenses</u>: You need to fill out a marriage intention in front of a Clerk or a notary; however, BOTH applicants must sign the official license in the presence of the Town Clerk before the license will be issued. If you are a Maine resident, you must file intentions in the municipality that at least one of you resides. Non-Maine residents may file intentions in any municipality.

<u>Voter Registration</u>: New residents may register to vote at any time during the year, even on Election Day! Proof of identity and residency is required at time of registration. Damariscotta has a total of 1869 registered voters, 668-Democrats, 498-Republicans, 85-Green Independent, 3-Libertarian and 615-Unenrolled (formerly considered 'Independent').

<u>Vehicle Registrations</u>: Excise tax is required to be paid on all vehicles and most boats in the municipality you reside. These funds stay within your municipality. In order to re-register a vehicle, please bring current proof of insurance, your old registration and current mileage. To register a new vehicle, dealership sale, you will need to bring the blue copy of the title application, proof of insurance, current mileage and proof that sales tax has been paid. (A brand new car will also require the window sticker from the dealership.) Person-to-person sale, you are required to bring a bill of sale with the year, make, model, vehicle identification number, and dollar amount paid. If the car is a 1995 or newer, you must have the title from the previous owner, with the backside filled

out. \*The State of Maine does not send reminder notices for renewal registrations.

**Boat Registration/ATV/Snowmobile Registration**: Damariscotta processes new and renewal boat registrations. For 'new-to-you' boat registrations, please bring in a clean bill of sale, and ME registration numbers if boat was previously registered in Maine. Sales tax will be collected at time of registration unless purchased through a dealership. If purchased from a dealership, please bring proof of paid sales tax and bill of sale from dealer. All boat registrations expire on December 31st.

In addition to processing vehicles and boats, we also process new registrations for ATVs and snowmobiles. A bill of sale will be needed in order to complete a new-to-you registration. You will also be required to pay sales tax at time of registration. All snowmobile and ATV registrations expire on June 30<sup>th</sup>.

<u>Dog License</u>: This year the Town licensed 65 dogs. Please bring proof of current rabies vaccination at time of registration. If the dog is spayed or neutered, we will need to see the spay or neutering certificate. Dog licenses expire every year on December 31<sup>st</sup>, and a late fee of \$25.00 is imposed as of February 1<sup>st</sup>. This is the State of Maine law and not something the Town is able to waive.

<u>Hunting & Fishing Licenses</u>: Maine residents: must be a resident for at least 3 months to obtain a resident license. For hunting licenses Maine residents must provide proof of prior license or proof of completion of hunters' safety course. Any nonresident is eligible to purchase a nonresident hunting license once proof of prior license, hunter safety course completion is provided.

#### Assessors' Agent's Report

Once again, in spite of the relatively small number of valid sales, the state-certified ratio for Damariscotta is virtually identical to that of last year. This percentage, used as a measure of assessment, relates sales prices to assessed values. This stability indicates that values continue to hold. The declared certified ratio was 100% for this fiscal year.

The Maine Legislature increased the Homestead Exemption to \$15,000 this year. The certified ratio of 100% means that the full amount of the exemption is applied to the valuation of the property.

I encourage you to contact this office, either by phone or email, if you have any questions or concerns regarding the taxation process. I welcome having the opportunity to check and refine our data, making whatever changes are warranted. The ultimate goal is to get things right so that the tax burden is spread fairly and equitably across town.

#### PROPERTY TAX RELIEF

The following exemptions are made available to taxpayers at a local level. Applications are available at the assessor's office or online and are due *on or before April 1st*.

- HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION To qualify, homeowners must be able to declare the property as their principal residence for at least the 12 months preceding the date of the application. Once the application is filed, the exemption remains until the owner sells or changes their place of residence.
- VETERAN EXEMPTION Any veteran or the widow of, who served active duty during a federally recognized war period and, if discharged or retired under honorable conditions. The Veteran must have reached age 62 or must be receiving a pension or compensation from the United States Government for total disability, either service or non-service connected.
- BLIND EXEMPTION Applicant must provide written proof from a medical doctor or eye care professional that they are legally blind.
- BETE Certain businesses may qualify for an exemption on personal property tax for equipment first subject to tax on April 1, 2008. This is an annual application.
- BETR Certain Businesses may qualify for reimbursement on personal property tax paid during the previous year. Taxpayers begin the application process by filing the form "801" with our office.

#### **Cemetery Committee Report**

Covering the period February 2016 through January 2017

Most noticeable to the community was the rebuilding of the arch wall at Walpole Cemetery on Bristol Road. Skillfully accomplished by the restoration specialists of Stone Age Masonry, the work included dismantling the existing structure, rebuilding the walls from the foundation up, resetting the arch and keystone, and repainting and reinstalling the gate and latch. The north pier was found to be completely split, so it was replaced. The original stone was set horizontally within the cemetery, to serve as a bench. The original catch-stone for the gate, which could not be reinstalled due to the presence of a casket, was set at one end of the bench to serve as a foot rest. Originally erected in 1897 by Capt. Thomas J. Woodward in memory of his parents, the structure was failing due to inadequate and improper maintenance over the ensuing 119 years. In advance of the work, as conditions were deteriorating, Mark Daiute of True North Surveying graciously donated his time to monitor the movement of the arch every few months.

The cemetery ordinance was reviewed, and the revised version was approved at Town Meeting in June. The mowing contract with J&H Landscaping was renewed for another three years, having received numerous compliments on the appearance of the grounds and the care and respect shown by the crew. The Permit to Install Cemetery Monument was revised to clarify the number and type of stones allowed on a lot. A \$10,000 bequest was received from the estate of Maxine Wright.

We assisted families with the purchase of 24 lots, eight burials (including one in mid-February), and four stone installations, as well as responding to various inquiries and leading tours for descendants.

The map of all known Damariscotta cemetery locations was posted to the Town web site, along with lot maps of Bethlehem, Hillside, Walpole, and various Ancient Burial Grounds as those became available. Map signs were installed at Bethlehem, Walpole, and the Old Hodgdon Yard portion of Hillside, with the sign for the Norris Yard portion of Hillside ready to be installed in spring 2017. Martha Dodge, Betsy Evans, and Karen Campbell assisted in the measuring and mapping of Heavner-Day (GR3) on the Pinkham Road, after Damariscotta Historical Society and Damariscotta-Newcastle Lions Club joined forces – and checkbooks – to have the trees removed from that site.

The committee prepared spreadsheets and began documenting the condition of all stones, completing the status for Bethlehem, Walpole, and the Old Hodgdon Yard at Hillside, and starting documentation of the Norris Yard at Hillside. That allowed us to set priorities for repairs and will enable us to monitor progress over the coming years. For safety's sake, a number of large monuments were professionally leveled and stabilized, and some old stones that had broken and fallen were repaired and reset in Hillside and Walpole. The Lincoln Academy service fraternity, Alpha Sigma Gamma, lent their muscles to the task of lifting sunken flush stones in Hillside, and a crew of Two Bridges inmates scraped lichen from stones.

Additional veterans were identified and marked, including Anson Chapman (aka Anson C. Merrill), Isaac Young, John Dyer, Elbridge House, Henry Huston, John Hull, Simon Prentice, and Henry Reed, all Civil War veterans, along with Revolutionary War veteran Sam Woodward. It was discovered in online pension records that Daniel Chapman had participated in the War of 1812, though his service is not mentioned in local records. Thanks to information from Glen Hayes in PA, we learned details of Civil War Corp. Willard Barstow's death at Gettysburg, and that he had been award the Kearney Cross.

Once again, volunteers have provided countless hours of service in our cemeteries. We were saddened by the passing of Jo Dolengowski in September. We celebrated the "retirement" of 92-

year-old William Rice, appreciating the countless years of care he provided for the Alden Chapman Cemetery. Jake Braley removed the tree that was starting to push over 1812 veteran Jacob Chapman's stone. Matt Lutkus lifted and levelled numerous foot stones and field stones in multiple cemeteries, as well as removed some small trees before they became big problems. Dick McLean refurbished more Civil War flag holders. Jason Warlick used his equipment to help the Lions and Historical Society with oversize logs at Heavner-Day. Ongoing care continues to be provided for the Ancient Burying Grounds by Steve & Karen O'Bryan, Lions Club, J&H Landscaping, Jackie Fraser, Damariscotta River Association, Greg & Bonnie Kipple, Jody Sprague, Lessner descendants, Chris Perry, Bob Harris, Gordon Isleib, George Dolengowski, Keith Plummer, Josh Pinkham, and William Burlin.

A presentation was made to the Newcastle Historical Society detailing the processes Damariscotta has used to research, locate, clean, and restore our cemeteries. The Chapman-Hall House docents met to learn about burial locations for the applicable families, then visited the sites.

Mysteries continue to arise from time to time. Thanks to the kindness of a neighbor, we were allowed to search the area *outside* of a cemetery and discovered a WSRC flag holder, a funeral home temporary marker for a woman we did not know was buried in the cemetery, and portions of a child-size grave border. The name on the border is not listed in any records located to date, stymying our search to identify the parents or the child's birth and death date(s).

To keep life from getting dull and boring, evidence of yet another numbering system surfaced for the Norris Yard section of Hillside, the fourth version so far. Discarded headstone pieces were found outside of Thompson Cemetery, and in the stone wall at Walpole. A family member notified us that a DAR flag holder did *not* belong on the lot where it was located, though attempts to find the correct location have so far been unsuccessful. New land owners were notified of the possibility of burials on their property, based on the available clues for documented sites not yet located; the Town Planner will incorporate a caution about that in the standard site-review checklist.

Ron Romano, author of a book on a famous gravestone carver, visited the area and identified stones which may have been done by that carver, a brother, or others in his shop. Mr. Romano also identified another carver's work, and provided valuable instruction in how to read the clues.

Road Commissioner Hugh Priebe has helped with several jobs including pulling stumps and building a large headstone-protection cover in preparation for the arch work, removing a stubborn bush that was threatening to topple two stones, cutting brush, repairing fences, eliminating a tripping hazard at the Bethlehem entrance, and filling large holes created by critters and grave collapses.

The Damariscotta Police Department was quick to assist when we discovered alcohol and drugrelated trash near the entrance to a cemetery, and kept a close eye on the area until the issue was resolved. Animal Control removed a dead raccoon. Poison ivy continues to provide challenges, though we are gradually getting the proliferation reduced.

Last, but far from least, the ladies in the Town Office support our efforts day in and day out throughout the year. Cheryl Pinkham, Michelle Cameron and Becky Bartolotta help with agendas, financial reports, photocopying, deed processing, lot sales, inquiry referrals, and special projects that make it easier for us to do our job. No matter how many times we interrupt their day, they are consistently cheerful and helpful.

# **Central Lincoln County Ambulance Service Inc.**

Hello,

I would like to share some of what we have been up to in the last year. We responded to a total of 2767 calls in 2016.

For the Town of Damariscotta we have responded to 613 Emergency calls, and have provided 56 Community Paramedicine Home visits.

The Community Home visits are now in the third year of the pilot project and we have been able to demonstrate a positive impact on the patients we have served. Wound care and bloodwork remain our top areas of referrals, along with vitals, respiratory management, and medication compliance. We have worked with asthma education and some congestive heart failure patients. Overall, the project is going well and we are gaining more support for reimbursement.

We have increased our training with our new Medical Control Doctor in an effort to continue to provide the best possible care. Doctor Matt Opacic is one of the Miles Hospital Emergency Department physicians. He has a tremendous amount of experience in Emergency Medicine and has helped us to implement our new stroke care program.

In 2016 we updated an old 2006 ambulance with a brand new 2016 model as part of our equipment plan. The cost was \$122,000. We also were fortunate to receive a private donation of \$24,000, approximately 50% of the cost to help purchase a 2007 used ambulance to replace a 2002 model van. In addition to that, we were able to purchase one more of the advanced Zoll Cardiac Monitors for \$28,000. This leaves us with just two more to go to finish our project of updating all of our monitors. As always, the town money we receive goes into our capital savings and is used towards equipment purchases.

# **Damariscotta Police Department**

"Together we make a difference." This motto has proven true again as we have survived another year and with the continued support from the community, we have kept the town safe. The Damariscotta Police Department would like to thank its citizens, Board of Selectmen, and Town Manager for their continued support throughout 2016.

The department responded to 12,200 calls for service. The officers made 196 arrests and stopped 1,174 vehicles totaling over \$35,000.00 in fines. The officers performed 137 hours of community policing which included foot patrols in the downtown district, being in Great Salt Bay School interacting with children, robbery trainings at the area banks, and various other activities. The remaining calls for service are spread between property checks, welfare checks, drug investigations, etc.

It is no secret that the horrible drug epidemic has reached out everywhere in Lincoln County. There were over 360 confirmed overdose deaths in Maine in 2016 alone. This is about 1 every day. Unfortunately, Damariscotta has been affected as well. Our agency had 1 fatal drug overdose as well as several overdose cases, both unresponsive and becoming unresponsive, in 2016. These situations continue to drive the need for a program that helps addicts get the help they need before the event turns tragic. The Damariscotta Police Department is pleased to announce it has joined a program known as the Lincoln County Recovery Collaborative, Bridges to Treatment Program. This is a county-wide program that aims to guide addicts down a path of recovery versus incarceration. Although the program is in its beginning stages, the progress has been amazing and the resources provided have been very helpful. It is important to understand this program in no way stops our officers from doing their job, it is just another useful tool to help aid in reducing crime and helping the community.

On a similar note our department is now carrying the very effective opioid reversal drug known as NARCAN. This drug has been instrumental in saving hundreds of lives across Maine. The official name for the drug is Naloxone. The drug is designed to reverse the effects of opioids and revive an individual that overdosed on the opioid. Every officer on the department has been given a supply of the drug and has been trained on its use. When we combine this tool with our AEDs and amazing ambulance crews, we will continue to help our citizens in their medical situations.

2016 yielded another awesome Trunk or Treat in the department's parking lot. There were hundreds of people who turned out for the event. I would like to give a special thanks to Camp Kieve for donating their time and equipment to the event. They provided a climbing wall for both children and adults and their staff was amazing. I would like to thank all the volunteers involved as well for all your hard work. This event is designed to give the children and parents an opportunity to meet with the officers in a fun and friendly environment. It is always great to meet new faces and give a safe environment for the children to trick or treat. We look forward to many more years of this event.

The 2016 Damariscotta Pumpkinfest went off without a hitch. The yearly event drew another large crowd and our department is tasked with keeping the traffic flowing as well as keeping the citizens and visitors safe during the event. I am happy to report there were no injuries related to the activities and we look forward to next year's events.

In closing, I would like to thank the citizens of our beautiful town for their continued support. Our department is young, motivated, ambitious, professional, and aimed at giving each and every one of you our undivided attention in your time of need.





During the 15-16 fiscal year, officers stopped 1,184 vehicles resulting in: 206 civil infractions, 526 warnings and 55 arrests or citations. In the 14-15 fiscal year there were a total of 1,353 motor vehicle stops, 213 warnings, 237 civil infractions and 56 arrests or citations, and in the 13-14 fiscal year there were 1,443 stops, 433 warnings, 138 civil infractions and 75 arrests or citations.

#### **Parking Tickets**

376 parking tickets were issued from July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2016. Fine amounts totaled \$8,600.00. Of those 277 have been paid. We have collected \$7,650.00 (including penalties). There are still 93 unpaid tickets which have been or are in the process of being sent to collections.



#### **Road Commissioner**

To the Board of Selectmen and Residents of the Town of Damariscotta,

The Public Works Department submits the following report that represents projects and work beginning, ongoing, and completed during the period of July 2015 through June 2016. The Department has been working to improve the building, grounds, and equipment in order to be in compliance with the DOT (Department of Transportation) guidelines. This year the Heater Road facility saw such improvements as a new roof and the painting of trim. The salt shed had collapsed and was re-erected with a winter kit and new walls were installed.

Some of our daily and seasonal duties include weekly trash collection of the downtown area, mowing multiple town properties, the upkeep of the Biscay Beach property, snow plowing and snow removal of the sidewalks, constant pot hole repair as well as repairing or replacing street signs on an as-needed basis. This spring we used the tractor and broom sweeper to clean up sand and salt left on the roadways after the winter plow season. Other areas of focus were the paving of School Street, shoulder work on Egypt Road, Belvedere Extension, and Pinkham Road as well as the replacing of culverts. The town has new street signs that have the town seal on them; they can be seen on the main roads in town.

This year the Damariscotta River Association donated new benches and picnic tables for Riverside Park. The town added a new bench by the docks and flower locations were fixed, which brought back color to those locations left empty for the last few years.

The on-going project, although a slow process, is the Bristol Road sidewalk. During the upcoming years the Town hopes to have the installation of new sidewalks connecting the downtown area to the Miles Hospital entrance.

The Public Works department continues to enjoy working with the other municipal departments to accomplish several goals throughout the town, while also assisting with many community events such as the Pirate Rendezvous, Pumpkinfest, and Earth Day clean up.

The Town completed final design work and sent out requests for proposals for High and School Streets and Branch Road paving projects. During the year, the Department assisted in plans to replace the Egypt Road culvert and, working with Great Salt Bay Sanitary District, to construct major sidewalk, drainage and water line improvements on Elm Street.

Great Salt Bay Sanitary District (GSBSD) is a publicly owned, quasi-municipal utility organized to provide safe drinking water in Damariscotta and Newcastle, and to provide wastewater treatment services in the Towns of Damariscotta, Newcastle, and Nobleboro. The District currently has 713 water customers and 1428 wastewater users. Scott Abbotoni is the Water Manager, overseeing all water operations, and LeeAnna Libby is the Wastewater Manager, overseeing all wastewater operations.

Our mission is to provide safe drinking water, adequate fire protection, and effective wastewater treatment. The District is committed to public health, customer service, and environmental protection.

The Drinking Water Division's water supply is "Little Pond," a pristine, 77-acre spring-fed pond with an ultraviolet light water treatment system as a primary disinfectant and chlorine as a secondary disinfectant.

The Welton Tank on Standpipe Rd. in Damariscotta and the Academy Hill Tank in Newcastle feed the Twin Villages.

In 2015 the Water Division replaced 1400 feet of aging A.C. Pipe that had had multiple leaks with new 12-inch H.D.P.E. pipe, therefore eliminating a problem area. During the process the District also replaced old fire hydrants with new ones. As not to excavate the High Street/School Street intersection in the future, the district made provisions for possible expansion down the remainder of School Street by installing valves and extending the main out of the intersection.

The Wastewater Division's wastewater treatment for Damariscotta and Newcastle consists of three aerated lagoons with a capacity of eight million gallons.

The lagoons were cleaned, the aeration system was upgraded and the lagoon liners were inspected in 2012.

In 2015 we began an upgrade to the main plant's electrical and blower system which was finished in 2016.

The Damariscotta Mills area of Newcastle and Nobleboro has a small sand filter, fed by septic tanks which are maintained by the district.

Scott Dodge Jr. of Walpole was hired as a new full time employee in the fall of 2016. The Great Salt Bay Sanitary District's operations are carried out by five full-time employees overseen by an elected six-member Board of Trustees. Representing Damariscotta are William Brewer, John Gallagher, and Raymond McConnell; representing Newcastle are Clayton Huntley and Alan Ray; and representing Nobleboro is Robert Whear. The Trustees meet the second Wednesday each month, 5 p.m. at the District office, located at 121 Piper Mill Road, Damariscotta. The public is encouraged to attend.

# **Nobleboro/Jefferson Transfer Facility**

The Transfer Station, operated by Nobleboro and Jefferson, and under contract with Bremen, Damariscotta and Newcastle, provides for the disposal of most types of solid waste generated in the five towns. This year our household waste went to PERC in Orrington. The construction and demolition bulky materials are hauled to a landfill in Norridgewock. We use the services of Lincoln County Recycling to recycle cardboard, newspaper, plastic and many other products. We also recycle our universal hazard waste (televisions, computer, fluorescent light bulbs, mercury switches and rechargeable batteries).

You will see the Transfer Station attendants out helping the customers with their trash and recyclables. They worked very hard to keep the facility neat & safe. Our hopes are that they make your trip to the Transfer Station a positive experience. The Town would like to give many thanks to our three employees - Barry Howell, Brandon Achorn & Linwood Rideout - for all they do for the Transfer Station.

At the Maine Solid Waste annual meeting Barry Howell was presented with the Manager of the Year Award, an award well deserved for his efforts at the Transfer Station. He works hard to save the towns money wherever he can by encouraging all the recycling programs. He has worked with Lincoln County Recycling to start collecting organist (food waste) for them to make into compost. He also set up a program with Paint Care which recycles all kinds of paint. This all takes items out of the solid waste mainstream, saving money.

In 2016 we installed a new set of scales. Our old scales were not able to get certified. The new scales have a metal surface rather than wood. The metal surface should last a lot longer.

This year with the effort of the employees and the public we saved money on the tipping costs of the trash. By doing this we were able to lower the tax commitment to the towns by 4.44%. We feel in the future we will be able to keep the tax commitment level.

The Transfer Station is open from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Tuesday through Saturday. The front gate is closed at 3:50 p.m. each night to allow time to close out the computer. We are closed on Sunday and Monday. This allows our staff to have two days off in a row.

We will continue to review our operations in an effort to provide good service and the most efficient Transfer Station possible. We are interested in your comments and recommendations and will attempt to incorporate them whenever possible.

# **Pemaquid Watershed Association**

In 2016 Pemaquid Watershed Association (PWA) celebrated its 50th year conserving the natural resources of the Pemaquid Peninsula through land and water stewardship and education. PWA's primary focus is on the 47 square miles of Pemaquid River watershed which includes Paradise ("Muddy") Pond, Little Pond, Biscay Pond, and Pemaquid Pond. Over half of Damariscotta is in the Pemaquid River watershed. As a Land Trust, PWA provides public access to trails, open space, and shorefront via eleven nature preserves. Doyle Preserve in Damariscotta offers 16 acres of woodland and 1,200 ft. on Pemaquid Pond. First National Bank has sponsored Doyle Preserve since 2004 via PWA's Adopt-a-Trail program.

Among PWA's 13 Board of Directors, six were Damariscotta residents including Bill Brewer, Sandi Day, Mike Kane, Joan Panek, Chris Roberts, and Hylie West. In April 2016 PWA purchased 584 Main St. in Damariscotta. In June the building became the organization's headquarters office. The office is open to the public weekdays 9am – 5pm and serves as a place for learning about how to enjoy and protect the Pemaquid River watershed.

PWA is proud to serve the citizens of Damariscotta during the July 2015-June 30, 2016 fiscal year:

- 7th season of water quality monitoring at Biscay Beach as a service to the Town of Damariscotta for safeguarding swimmers' health and protecting environmental quality.
- 8th year of coordinating the LakeSmart Program, providing free technical assistance to residents on Biscay, Paradise, and Pemaquid Ponds to help protect pondwater quality.
- 12th year of the Courtesy Boat Inspection program to educate boaters and minimize the risk of non-native plants invading the ponds within the Pemaquid River watershed.

# **Damariscotta K-12 Education Report**

#### **Great Salt Bay Community School:**

Great Salt Bay Community School is a K-8 grade school serving the children of Bremen, Damariscotta, and Newcastle. The mission of the school is to provide a nurturing, safe, and enjoyable environment in which all children are challenged and inspired to pursue excellence in all aspects of their education.

At all grade levels our learning curriculum is guided by the Maine learning standards. As described by the Maine Department of Education, these "academic standards provide a set of clear expectations as to what students should know, understand, and be able to explain as they progress through each K-12 grade level." These standards include: English language arts, mathematics, science & technology, social studies, health & physical education, and visual & performing arts. In order to ensure the quality of our educational program, our students in grades 3 - 8 participate in the Maine Educational Assessment (MEA). Consistently, our students have performed above the state average in the areas of reading and mathematics at almost all grade levels. On the science MEAs, our fifth and eighth grade students performed well above the state average.

Seeking to provide our students with an enriching, vibrant, 21st century education, our teachers and staff supplement the classroom experience with visiting educators and field trips. Some of the visiting educators have included Mary Boothby (8th grade printmaking), Mary Cerullo (3rd grade oyster program), Tim Dinsmore (7th grade archeology unit), Sara Gladu (DRA - environmental education), John Meader (myths & astronomy), Belinda Ray (5th grade writing program), and staff from Chewonki and Darling Marine Center. Our students have participated in field trips to Biscay Orchards, Coastal Maine Botanical Gardens in Boothbay, Camden State Park, Maine State Museum, and Old Fort Western.

Great Salt Bay School recognizes that co-curricular and extracurricular programs are an integral part of the total educational program. The co-curricular programs include debate team, drama club, jazz band, math team, robotics club, student council, and yearbook. Our student athletes can participate in archery, basketball, cheerleading, cross country, field hockey, golf, soccer, softball, and track & field. In all of these sports, students have the opportunity to develop good sports skills and attitudes while playing against other schools in AOS 93, as well as the other schools in the Busline League.

Throughout the year the school hosts a number of events to strengthen the sense of community within the school and with the families of GSB. In the fall we gather together for our Open House and PTO-sponsored Welcome Back Dinner, the Harvest Fair, and parent/teacher conferences. In the winter we showcase our music and arts programs with the Winter Band and Choral Concerts, the Beginner Band Concert, the Strings Concert, and the Young Artist Showcase. In the spring we encourage families to get involved in Unplug It Week, the Bike Rodeo, spring concerts, and finally our 8th grade graduation.

Recognizing the importance of connecting our students to their community, our school has built strong community educational collaborations. These include the Darling Center, DRA, Farms & Farms Kitchen, Hidden Valley Nature Center, Camp Kieve, Miles of Friends, Skidompha Library, and the CLC YMCA. Moreover, we pride ourselves in our efforts to give back to community. Each winter our school community sponsors a food drive, GSB Cares-A-Ton, which helps our local food

pantry and we host a Red Cross blood drive. This year GSB has expanded its involvement with our senior living communities by bringing our musicians to perform at Coves Edge and Lincoln Home. These experiences enrich the lives of all those involved, especially our children.

Finally, Great Salt Bay Community School is fortunate to have an active PTO. The mission of the PTO is "to act as an organization that supports GSB students in their many activities and provide assistance to GSB staff in their numerous programs." The PTO organizes fundraisers, including a Jog-a-thon in September and a "Spring \$5 Fundraiser," with all proceeds benefiting the school in the form of school-wide cultural events, classroom tools, student scholarships, and extracurricular events. The PTO provides parents the opportunity to learn more about what goes on at GSB, as well as information on issues and topics that are important to parents and students. In addition to the PTO, the school community benefits from the Friends of Great Salt Bay. This non-profit organization is specifically dedicated to supporting our school with a mission to "Enhance the Education of GSB students."

Each year the Great Salt Bay Community School strives to make the educational experience stronger for its students. Our goal is to "Be Better Than Our Best." Our students are blessed to live in a community that recognizes that supporting its public school is one of the most important investments of all. Together we are making our future stronger as a community and as a nation by educating our children. Thank you for your support of Great Salt Bay Community School.

#### Damariscotta, Grades 9-12:

Damariscotta has 105 students in grades 9-12, with 91 who attend Lincoln Academy. 14 students attend other public and private schools outside AOS 93 borders. Our students continue to thrive and achieve to high levels. There are 24 students graduating and 19 students entering grade nine. Central Office Administrators of the AOS meet with the Head of School of Lincoln Academy and his Assistants routinely to align curriculum and refine plans to prepare our grade eight students for a successful transition and experience at the Academy.

# Central Lincoln County (AOS#93) Adult and Community Education Annual Report

CLC Adult and Community Education provided services to over 900 adults in 2016. We offered the HiSET high school completion program, assisted adults in preparing for college, worked with literacy students and English language learners, provided medical certificate programs and served up a wide variety of enrichment classes for all ages.

We provide basic literacy services along with high school completion classes free of charge in our Learning Center program on Tuesday and Thursday evenings and Monday mornings. Free College Transitions courses are offered through The Lincoln County College Connection (TLC³) – a cooperative program with 3 other Lincoln County Adult Education programs. Dozens of adults from Lincoln County participated in classes that will help them prepare for college through that program.

In 2015-16 we had only 4 students complete a high school credential, a lower number than usual for our program. Another 16 worked towards a high school credential or on basic language and math skills. Anyone 17 or older who is out of school and wants to earn a high school credential or who needs to improve their reading, writing or English language skills should contact us to get started.

We continue to work with Lincoln County Healthcare to provide vocational training in several medical programs. In response to the critical need for CNAs we started a CNA apprenticeship program to allow students to "earn while they learn." In total we conducted 3 Certified Nursing Assistant courses with 24 students completing the program and receiving certification and employment. We were also able to offer CPR, CRMA and PSS classes.

Hundreds of students enjoyed the more than 120 low-cost, high impact courses offered in Community Education. We continued our combined brochure with the RSU40 Adult Ed brochure which offers a single point of information for classes throughout Lincoln County.

# **Lincoln Academy**

Lincoln Academy is an independent secondary school chartered in 1801 to serve the midcoast area. It offers a comprehensive program, including courses at all levels in the areas of English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, World Languages, Fine and Performing Arts, Technology Education, Physical Education, and Health. Regional Vocational, Alternative Education, and Special Education programs are available. On a ten-year cycle Lincoln Academy is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC), and was most recently reaccredited in 2015.

In 2017 Lincoln Academy will have newly constructed/renovated fields for both the baseball and softball teams. Other new facilities include The Cable-Burns Applied Technology and Engineering Center (ATEC), Kiah Bayley Hall Dormitory, and the William A. Clark Athletic Field, which all opened in 2015.

Governance: Lincoln Academy is governed by an independent Board of Trustees. Officers include: Christine Wajer '85, President; Sarah Maurer, Vice-President; Dennis Prior '91, Secretary; Robert Nelson, Treasurer. Members include: Ann McFarland '73, Faustine Reny '01, Robert Baldwin '62, Stephen Dixon, Lisa Masters '83, Jon McKane, Karen Moran, William Morgner, Pam Gormley, Marcus Hutchins, and Hugh Riddleberger. David Sturdevant is Head of School.

The Students Body, Day and Residential: Lincoln Academy has a current enrollment of 587 students in the 2016-17 school year. The majority of students come from 16 local towns. 89 residential students come from 19 countries around the world. After 5 consecutive years of growth, the Residential population has met available housing capacity and for the foreseeable future will remain between 80 and 90 students.

**Graduates:** Of the 148 graduates in the Class of 2016, 102 enrolled in postsecondary education; 90 enrolled in 4-year colleges/universities,12 enrolled in programs shorter than 4-year (2 year and certificate programs), 43 are employed/seeking employment, and 3 enlisted in military service.

**Curriculum:** Lincoln Academy remains committed to its comprehensive curriculum as we strive to meet the needs of all students. We have added new courses this year, including AP Computer Science Principles, Introduction to Design, Engineering and Technology, Wood Projects, Metal Projects, Mechanical Projects, and Introduction to Engineering Design. The new courses take advantage of the space and tools in the ATEC building, as well as serve our increasingly diverse population of day and residential students.

**Finances:** Unlike most independent schools, The Board does not set day tuition. Because most students' tuition is paid by their sending towns, the tuition is established by the State Department of Education using a formula based on average per pupil expenditures of Maine public high schools during the previous two years. The tuition for the 2016-17 school year was increased by 3.9% from the prior year to \$10,530.49 per pupil. The Insured Value (IV) factor is an amount in addition to tuition intended to fund capital maintenance and debt service. The legislated IV factor amount of 10% was reduced in 2009 to 5% and remained at 5% through 2013-14. The legislature voted to partially restore the IV by voting to increase the amount to 6% of the calculated tuition figure for 2014-15. The 6% rate was carried over into 2016-17 and is \$631.83 per pupil for this year. While towns are allowed to continue to pay the full 10% and some of our area towns have done that in the past, this year all sending towns have elected to pay the mandatory 6% rate.

**Supporting Lincoln:** The state-determined tuition is simply not enough to provide the quality educational experience that Lincoln Academy promises to every student. Because of this, LA depends on support from donors to the Lincoln Fund to make up the deficit. Private contributions have allowed Lincoln to support programs and capital improvements. Money raised through the Lincoln Fund supports students and faculty, and is vital to the life of the school. Since 1997, over \$1.625M has been contributed to general operations, over \$715 for specific programs, and about \$15M for capital projects. Contributions to annual and capital campaigns provide for the perpetuation of and improvements to LA's programs and physical plant without increasing local taxes.

# Planning Board, Planner & Land Use Committee

ANNUAL REPORT - FY 2016 (July 1, 2015 - June 30, 2016)

Ordinance Development: At the June 2016 Town Meeting, voters approved a number of technical changes to the Zoning, Floodplain and Shoreland Zoning Ordinances to correct discrepancies in indexing and boundary lines of zoning districts. Also approved were expansions of the C2 Commercial District at the Hagar property on Biscay Road and the Giggey property on Belvedere Road. Of major significance was the approval of a new stand-alone Sign Ordinance which set standards for types, sizes and illumination of signs in the various zoning districts from commercial to residential to rural. The Planning Board took a novel approach to development of the ordinance by bringing in a neutral facilitator to navigate the competing demands on the sign ordinance. This approach was undoubtedly successful in helping forge greater consensus on issues about the draft sign ordinance allowing for its eventual passage.

<u>Long-Range Planning</u>: The Waterfront Committee wrapped up its two years of work on the town waterfront plan with a report to the Selectman in August 2015. Gathered from 276 surveys, the Report identified six major features of the waterfront plan:

- (1) Harbor parking lot reconstruction both below and above ground and a seawall to protect Main Street buildings from the 100-year flood for at least 50 years.
  - (2) Acquire 24 more parking spaces at or near the harbor.
  - (3) Construct public restrooms at the Harbor parking lot.
- (4) Reconstruct Taco Alley as the primary pedestrian/ bicycle access from Main Street to the harbor.
  - (5) Consider a boardwalk along the harbor shoreline.
  - (6) Consider structures at Misery Gulch either a pedestrian bridge or a vehicle parking area.

The Town Planner with the Town Manger continued to explore grant possibilities for funding the new seawall. So far our seawall has not qualified for FEMA or Army Corps of Engineer grants that generally seem to be for larger-scale projects and for locales with long-standing and frequent flooding. In contrast, we represent the newer concerns of floodprone areas considering forecasted future flood damage as sea level rise and storm surge continue.

<u>Land Use Committee</u>: In early 2016 the Selectmen appointed a Land Use Committee to implement the 2015 Comprehensive Plan staffed by the Town Planner. Review of the priorities of the Plan resulted in the Committee deciding to concentrate on goals for aiding aging in place, historic preservation of the downtown and waterfront, and smart growth measures to promote rural conservation and wildlife corridors. It was decided that the initial project was developing an accessory apartment ordinance that would enable aging homeowners to rent out an on-site apartment for additional income, move into the accessory apartment themselves to make room for a caregiver or renters to stay in the big house section. The accessory apartment ordinance would pertain to all size lots, even for those houses on already substandard small lots.

<u>Conferences and Workshops</u>: On a trip organized by the Lincoln County Regional Planning Commission (LCRPC) to the UMO Composites Research Laboratory in Orono, Town staff broached the possibility of collaborating with the Center in using their composite wall panels for our sea wall. These panels do not rust or erode from salt water as traditional cement and rebar walls do. They therefore may represent a significant long-term operational cost saving. The Town is continuing to explore this with the UMO laboratory and all other avenues of funding possibilities.

<u>Development Review</u>: Planning Board permitting activity during 2015/16 responded to a number of smaller commercial developments but also to proposals for multi-unit housing developments for retirees and for working households. A small-scale home occupation day care in the Rural

District was approved. A small bakery next to Chasse Marine was approved. The Board continued to work on securing appropriate outdoor screening and overnight storage of sale goods from a new pawn shop on Business Route One. A small automobile detailing shop on Biscay Road was also approved. Under the Shoreland Zoning Ordinance, a new dock—float system for the Pemaquid Oyster Company on the Damariscotta River was reviewed and approved but was contested at the Board of appeals by an abutter. The issue eventually was resolved through arbitration, the dock-float being able to be installed seasonally.

Of the three multi-unit proposals before the Planning Board in 2015/16, two continued through the site plan review process: the Stepping Stone multi-unit affordable housing proposal on the former Blue Haven property at Hodgdon and Pleasant Streets and the Inn-Along-the-Way (IAW) cluster PUD (Planned Unit Development) proposal for aging retiree people at the former Chapman Farm at the Main Street/Route One intersection. The IAW proposes an inn be adapted from the old farmhouse with 8 apartments, use of the old barn for a community center, possibly a café and 17 single-household dwellings in the back with about 9 acres set aside as permanent open space. The IAW proposal is likely the first cluster PUD in town history.

# **Code Enforcement Officer's Report**

This past year saw more of an increase in building permits and land use permits than in the last few years.

I have been taking classes to stay up with the required credits to hold all of the various licenses that I have. As of January 1<sup>st</sup> of this year all Code Enforcement Officers needed to be trained to be a "Mandatory Reporter," someone who has to report suspected abuse or neglect of any kind to DHHS if observed.

I am presently certified in all aspects of my job through 2024.

We issued 57 building permits for the 2015-2016 fiscal year. We also issued 31 interior plumbing permits and 3 for new septic systems.

Any building, addition, or remodel needs to be permitted and, if you get an after the fact permit, the fees are doubled. There also could be monetary penalties added. Any contracted work done in the Shoreland Zone (within 250 feet of water) needs to be performed by a licensed contractor. The contractor needs the state certification number on the permit. If not certified, the contractor will be facing fines from both the State and the Town. It is the homeowners' responsibility to see that any permits are in place before construction begins, including the clearing of land for any type of development.

We have a new sign ordinance and any sign – temporary, permanent or seasonal – needs a permit.

We also have a new fee schedule for building and land use including increased plumbing fees.

### **Town Manager**

It is my pleasure to once again provide you with a report on the overall management and administration of your Town government. The Board of Selectmen continues to adopt an annual work plan for the Town administration that helps provide the Town staff with overall direction and focus for the year. My review of the Town's accomplishments is organized by the goals listed in the work plan.

#### Financial Sustainability-

**Balanced Budget-** The Town ended the fiscal year under budget while still accomplishing all of the major tasks in the Selectmen's work plan. Holding the line on property tax-funded expenditures became a challenge due to increases in education expenses and, in particular, the costs associated with special needs education. In the coming year the property tax needed to fund local government services is projected to decrease.

**Town Investments-** As reported in previous years, because the Town uses the services of a professional fund manager, State Statutes allow for increased flexibility in the investment of the Town's trust funds, enabling us to see significantly higher rates of return over the long term. The Town also uses the services of the fund manager to invest capital reserves in "fixed income" accounts, resulting in much higher rates of return than would be obtained from certificates of deposit.

**Town Debt-** The Town's "consolidated loan" debt was paid off in October 2016. In the later part of the calendar year, the Town made the decision to take advantage of historically low interest rates to fund bond issues to complete the Elm Street Sidewalk Project and the purchase of a multifunction tractor for Public Works. In addition, voters agreed to use bond financing to set aside some of the funding needed for the construction of a restroom downtown and the replacement of a failing culvert on Egypt Road. As of December, 2016, the Town's debt stood at \$573,200.

#### Infrastructure-

**Road Paving-** The Town Public Works Committee and staff worked with the Maine Department of Transportation (MDOT) to upgrade their planned paving improvements to Biscay Road and Main and School Streets. High Street, the Town-maintained section of School Street, and Branch Road were repaved early in Fiscal Year 2016 as part of the Town's capital improvement program.

**Five Year Capital Improvement Plan-** Town staff, the Public Works Committee and the Board of Selectmen continue to annually develop a five-year capital improvement plan as a longer term planning tool.

Waterfront Improvement Project- The Town continues to seek major funding to implement flood resiliency measures to protect buildings in downtown that are within the 1% flood zone. This has significant implications for long term viability of downtown and, more immediately, the cost for flood insurance for properties. The Town is also striving to make some of the less costly improvements to the waterfront area through private donations.

**Changes in the public works operation-** During the year, the Interlocal public works department shared with the Town of Newcastle was dissolved. This change resulted in Damariscotta having one full-time and one seasonal employee focused on the Town's ongoing maintenance needs. Oversight is provided by me as Town Manager and a citizen public works committee.

Other infrastructure projects and contracts- As is reported in the Cemetery Committee's annual report, the Town contracted for repairs to the Walpole Cemetery arch, a significant historical structure. The Town replaced its salt shed that had been destroyed during the previous winter and it secured important public works and engineering services contracts that supplement the work that can be accomplished in house.

#### **Public Safety-**

Please see the reports submitted by the two departments for summaries of their activities during the past year.

#### **Economic Development-**

Business interest in Damariscotta increased as the national and state economies rebounded. The Town has one of the most vibrant downtowns in the State. Town staff continue to encourage business development on Center Street near the US 1 Bypass and along Main Street outside of downtown.

#### **Community Development-**

Comprehensive Plan- The update to the Town's Comprehensive Plan, adopted at the June 2014 Annual Town Meeting has become the basis for the Town's long-term planning efforts. In late 2014 the Board of Selectmen and the Planning Board held a joint workshop to strategize on the development of land use regulation changes that will encourage such changes as increased opportunities for "aging in place" and economic development. One key objective developed during that meeting, the development of an "accessory use" amendment to the Land Use Ordinance, was later approved by Town Meeting. A Land Use Ordinance Committee is currently working on two other objectives identified in the Comprehensive Plan, the development of an historic preservation ordinance and a plan to promote wildlife corridors in town.

**Sign Ordinance-** After multiple public hearings and citizen information meetings, the Planning Board completed a draft Sign Ordinance that was approved at the June 2016 Town Meeting. The new ordinance brought Town laws in compliance with a Supreme Court ruling that requires that local regulations be content neutral, it changed a Land Use Ordinance so that no new electronically changeable signs are allowed in the downtown (C-1) District, it allowed electronically changeable signs to be constructed in the C-2 Business District and it restricts the number and size of sandwich board signs.

#### **Intergovernmental Connections-**

**Interlocal Agreements-** The Town continues to have joint ordinances with the Town of Newcastle for harbor management and shellfish harvesting oversight functions. The Town also has agreements with the Lincoln County Sheriff's Office for animal control and shellfish warden services (jointly with Newcastle).

**State and Local Government Contacts-** The Town continues to enjoy very positive and productive working relationships with key staff in the State Departments of Transportation, Community Development, Environmental Protection and Economic Development; Lincoln County Regional Planning staff; both State legislators; Great Salt Bay Sanitary District staff; other town and city governments; School District staff; and Lincoln County Commissioners and employees.

#### Citizen Communications/Outreach-

**Town e-Newsletter-** The Town's "News Briefs from the Town Offices" email newsletter currently has 490 "active" contacts. The newsletters have been sent out on an average of once per month.

**Town Manager Notes-** The "Town Manager Notes" that accompany each Board of Selectmen's Agenda have also provided an effective means of communicating not only with the Selectmen, but also with citizens and the news media. This document is emailed to over 85 households and businesses in addition to the Selectmen and Town staff.

**Other Community Contacts-** Town staff continue to have very good working relationships with local business associations and non-profit groups including the Twin Villages Alliance, the Chamber of Commerce, Spectrum Generations , the Rotary Club, Damariscotta River Association, and Pemaquid Watershed Association.

Town Manager's Budget Message

Dear Damariscotta Taxpayers:

Included in the Annual Town Meeting Warrant is the Board of Selectmen's and Budget Committee's recommended Town Budget for Fiscal Year 2018 (July 1, 2017 to June 30, 2018). If approved at Town Meeting, it will result in a minimal change in the 4.58 property tax mil rate for Town Government. The other budgets that determine the FY 2018 property tax rate are the budgets for education (11.33 mils in FY17) and the County Assessment (1.31 mils in FY 17). The total property tax mil rate for FY 17 is 17.22.

When all fees, taxes and grants are taken in account, the overall recommended budget increase for the Town portion of the budget is 1.8 percent over the FY 2017 approved budget. The only portion of the education budget included in the Town Manager's proposed budget is the amount that is requested to be allocated for adult education. Both the secondary and primary school budgets are submitted to the Town Meeting legislative body separately. The recommended budget does not include the overlay that the Board of Assessors will determine as part of the Tax Commitment in July.

Under the revenue section of the budget, revenue sharing has been budgeted at \$ 117,138 based on a projection of revenues in the State's Biennial Budget. It is important to point out that for the fifth year in a row, it is anticipated that the Governor and the State Legislature will divert funds from municipal revenue sharing to meet other State budget obligations. If the State had continued to provide revenue sharing contributions at the statutory level, the estimated revenue to the Town would be \$ 292,845 in FY 2018.

Also, under the revenue section, the Board of Selectmen's and Budget Committee's recommended budget provides for the transfer of funds from the undesignated reserves to reduce the amount of a property tax increase for the coming year. The amount carried over from the undesignated fund balance this year is \$97,500. For FY 2018, it is recommended that \$150,000 be carried over from this fund. At this point, based on the recently completed FY 2016 audit, I am projecting that there will be approximately \$1,044,000 in the undesignated fund balance in June, 2017.

From an overview standpoint, the proposed total budget of \$2,369,579 contains very little in the way of significant changes. The larger line item increases are shown in the employer share of healthcare costs, increases in snow plow contracted costs, and the recommended funding for capital reserves.

The Town Charter requires that the Manager provide a report of the Town's current indebtedness in this transmittal message. The current debt stands at \$573,200. This is comprised of the fire truck loan that the Town obtained in 2014 and the two bond issues that were approved at a Special Town Meeting in November, 2016.

Although the current budget and this recommended budget could be considered a "status quo" financial plan, the service levels that are funded by property tax dollars, fees and grants will continue to provide an aggressive capital improvement program and compensation for a productive and highly committed staff, as well as a significant allocation for fixed expenses of which the Town has little control.

I would like to thank the Board of Selectmen and the Budget Committee for their thorough review of the Town Manager's recommended budget. Moreover, I am especially appreciative of the efforts of Town Treasurer Cheryl Pinkham who coordinated the Town staff's preparation of this document and the Town department heads for submitting budget requests that are mindful of the Town's limited financial resources.

I look forward to reviewing this budget with you at Town Meeting and responding to any questions that you may have on the Town's proposed expenditures and anticipated revenues.

### **Auditor's Responsibility**

Our responsibility is to express opinions on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements or to the basic financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the combining and individual nonmajor fund financial statements are fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the basic financial statements as a whole.

The introductory and statistical sections have not been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and, accordingly, we do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on them.

## **U.S. Senator's Report**

Washington, DC

Dear Friends of Damariscotta:

Since being sworn into the Senate in 2013, I have made it my mission to address at the federal level the most important issues facing our great state. Working closely with my colleagues in the Maine Congressional Delegation, we've been able to successfully secure a number of legislative victories that support our state's economy, our rich traditions, and the hardworking people I am proud to represent.

In an increasingly polarized Congress, my goal as an Independent is to put partisanship aside, build consensus and further common-sense solutions to address the needs of the American people. To this end, I have cofounded the Former Governors Caucus, a group of former state executives who are frustrated with legislative gridlock and eager to find bipartisan solutions. And as always, I aim to bridge the partisan divide by hosting barbeque dinners in Washington with colleagues ranging from Ted Cruz to Elizabeth Warren. If you know a person's children, then you see them as a mother or father and not a rival vote, and working to further personal dialogue and build relationships can lay the foundation for successful legislation.

One of the accomplishments of which I am most proud is the legislative victory that protects our college students and their families from an expensive hike in student loan interest rates. In 2013, as students faced a significant spike in interest rates that would have taken thousands of dollars out of their pockets, I brought together colleagues from across the political spectrum to broker compromise legislation called the Bipartisan Student Loan Certainty Act. Thanks to this bill, students will save \$50 billion over the next 10 years by lowering their interest rates, which means that a student in Maine will now save between \$3,000 and \$6,000 over the life of their loan.

Being an Independent in the Senate has allowed me to make calls and vote on policies that are best for Maine, but it has also made it possible to play key roles in finding simple solutions and legislative fixes that make good commonsense to both parties. Of course, much of what we do in the Senate doesn't happen on the Senate floor, or even in committee. Instead, it involves working across all levels of government to ensure the State of Maine receives attention and support from the federal government.

Take, for example, the opioid and heroin epidemic devastating communities across our state. While Congress has passed legislative solutions aimed at expanding access to medical treatment, I've also pressed for other changes that can be accomplished more quickly and make a more immediate difference in Maine. For example, I successfully urged the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to increase the number of patients to whom a doctor can provide medication-assisted treatment, and in 2015 brought the Director of the Office of National Drug Control Policy to Brewer to meet directly with Mainers and hear their stories. I've also engaged law enforcement – including the Drug Enforcement Agency – to crack down on the production of opioids and work to limit their diversion. Together, Senator Collins and I helped pass the Northern Border Security Review Act to combat drug and human trafficking along our border with Canada.

While the opioid epidemic is certainly our biggest public health crisis, job loss in Maine is still our number one economic problem and that's why we need to focus on bringing good paying jobs back to Maine and protecting the ones we still have. As a member of the Armed Services Committee, I teamed up with Senator Collins and Representative Poliquin to successfully secure a provision in the defense bill that can help domestic shoe manufacturers like New Balance. The three of us also worked together with the Department of Commerce to establish an Economic

Development Assessment Team, known as an EDAT, to assist Maine's forest industry in the wake of several mill closures. We have an incredible spirit of innovation and ingenuity in Maine and I believe finding ways to invest in that spirit will reignite Maine's forest products sector and our economy. Part of our economic path forward must also include expanding access to highspeed broadband, which can help connect our businesses and communities to information and economic opportunities.

As a member of the Senate Armed Services and Intelligence Committees, I work to keep Maine and our nation safe. Part of that important work means continuing to work for funding for the construction of Navy ships that will be used to protect American interests across the globe. We all know that "Bath Built is Best Built," which is why I've fought to authorize funding for Navy ships built at BIW. The best way to preserve peace is by deterring war through unassailable strength, and to do that we must support our shipbuilders and our brave service members and invest in our military. I strive to meet this solemn responsibility every day as a member of these committees, which is why I hardly ever miss a hearing and take great care in overseeing the agencies sworn to keep us safe. Armed Services Chairman John McCain called me "one of the most serious and hardworking members" of the Committee, and that's a humbling compliment from a true American hero.

As a public servant, it is critical to me to listen and learn from you, which is why staying connected with people from all over our beautiful state remains a top priority for my work in the Senate. # **U.S. Senator's Report**

Washington, DC

It is an honor to represent Maine in the United States Senate. I am grateful for the trust the people of our State have placed in me and welcome this opportunity to share some key accomplishments.

Growing our economy by encouraging job creation remains a top priority. The tax relief bill enacted during this last Congress contains provisions I authored to provide small businesses with the certainty that they need to invest, grow, and, most important, hire new workers. The 2017 National Defense Authorization Act includes a provision the Maine delegation worked together to champion requiring that military recruits be provided with athletic footwear made in America, as is required for other equipment and uniform items whenever possible. This is a great victory for our troops and for the 900 skilled workers at New Balance factories here in Maine.

Maine's contributions to our national security stretch from Kittery to Limestone. As a senior member of the Appropriations Committee, I successfully advocated for critical funding for projects at the Portsmouth Naval Shipyard and \$1 billion towards the construction of an additional ship that will likely be built at Bath Iron Works. This funding will strengthen the Navy and our national security, and the additional destroyer will help meet the Navy's goal of a 355-ship fleet.

Maine's growing population of older individuals creates many challenges. That's why, as Chairman of the Senate Aging Committee, my top three priorities are fighting fraud and financial abuse directed at our nation's seniors, increasing investments in biomedical research, and improving retirement security.

The Aging Committee's toll-free hotline (1-855-303-9470) makes it easier for senior citizens to report suspected fraud and receive assistance. Last May, a call to the hotline helped lead to the arrest of a national crime ring targeting seniors, and in June I worked to secure the humanitarian release of a Maine senior who had been imprisoned in Spain after being victimized by an international drug smuggling scam.

The Aging Committee also released an extensive report detailing the findings of our bipartisan investigation into the abrupt and dramatic price increases for prescription drugs whose patents expired long ago.

I advocated strongly for the \$2 billion increase in funding for the National Institutes of Health to advance research on such diseases as diabetes and Alzheimer's. I also championed and authored portions of the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Cures Act that will further support biomedical innovation and make significant reforms to our mental health system.

The Senate also took steps in the past year to combat the nation's heroin and opioid epidemic by passing the Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery Act (CARA), which I was proud to cosponsor. CARA is a monumental step forward in our effort to address the devastating addiction crisis affecting countless families and communities across the country and right here in Maine.

A Maine value that always guides me is our unsurpassed work ethic. In December 2016, I cast my 6,236<sup>th</sup> consecutive vote, continuing my record of never missing a roll-call vote since my Senate service began in 1997.

Maine has a long tradition of civil participation in both state and local government, and I thank you for being informed and involved citizens.

My vision for Maine is prosperity, not poverty. For this reason, one of my top priorities continues to be the reduction and eventual elimination of the income tax. Raising the minimum wage is not the path out of poverty; I want Mainers to earn a career wage. Reducing the income tax is the biggest and most immediate pay raise for all hard-working Mainers.

Not only does an income tax cut put more money back in your pockets, but it will also attract businesses that can offer good-paying careers to keep our young people here. It shows the nation that we are serious about wanting people and businesses to come – and stay – in Maine.

Unfortunately, voters approved a referendum question to raise the income tax to 10.15% on successful Maine households and small businesses. Enacting the second highest income tax rate in the country shows the nation we are eager to punish people for being successful. It will drive them out of our state and make it even more difficult to attract much-needed doctors, dentists, scientists, engineers and other professionals to Maine. They can live in neighboring New Hampshire, which takes no income tax from their paychecks. As successful people leave Maine, state and municipal government will lose the significant amount they pay in property, sales and income taxes. This will put even more upward pressure on local property taxes. Municipalities will have to get more creative to provide local services without increasing property taxes. Reforming the tree growth program, collecting property taxes on land in conservation or preservation programs, charging a payment in lieu of taxes on state land that is taken off the property tax rolls and having non-profit organizations pay a two-percent tax on their net revenues are all ways for municipalities to increase revenues.
