TOWN MANAGER NOTES – DECEMBER 19, 2018 BOARD OF SELECTMEN'S MEETING

Public Hearing/Special Town Meeting

The following is taken from the email newsletter that I sent out earlier this week:

A special Town Meeting has been scheduled for Wednesday, December 19 for Damariscotta citizens to decide whether they will approve transferring \$90,000 from the Town's fund balance (surplus) account to supplement the funds currently available for construction of the downtown restroom. A public hearing will take place at 5:30 followed immediately after by the special meeting.

On October 24, the Town received bids well in excess of the \$300,000 set aside for the building's construction. The Board of Selectmen formally rejected the three bids on November 7. Since then, the Town's Restroom Construction Committee, Wright-Pierce Engineers, Phelps Architects and Town staff have been working to bring the restroom construction costs more in line with the funds available. The firm selected to do the construction, Medomak Construction, has provided a modified proposal of \$374,000. I recommended and the Selectmen approved asking the Town Meeting for the additional \$74,000 that is needed for construction and \$16,000 for contingency bringing the total additional request to \$90,000. The committee, the engineering firm and the architect will continue to work to see if the cost can be trimmed further.

Assuming no adjustments are made in the current cost projections, the following is the breakdown of the cost to build the new restroom:

Land purchase: \$90,000

Design, Engineering and Project Management: \$70,000

Building Construction: \$374,000

Misc. including legal, surveying, soil tests and modification of utility lines: \$13,500

Contingency: \$16,000

Total: \$563,500

Project Revenue is comprised of the following:

Private donations: \$385,200

State Grant: \$17,300

November 2016 Bond Issue: \$60,000 Capital Project Fund: \$11,000



Total: \$563,500

If the additional funding is not approved, alternatives could include modifying the design to provide a much more utilitarian building similar to what one would find in a municipal sports park. This alternative may not meet the objectives of many of the individuals and

businesses who have donated most of the funding for the project.

It is important to note that although the size and look of the restroom building have been changed from what was initially proposed by the architect, the building design still provides for the construction of a building that reflects the nineteenth century architecture of our historic downtown and sets a standard for future private construction that may occur adjacent to the parking lot. As currently designed, the restroom will also be constructed of high-quality materials that minimize future maintenance and cleaning expense and, to the extent possible, reduce the opportunities for vandalism.

According to Chief Warlick, the gift consists of replacement metal plates that are inserted into the officers' bullet proof vests. Although the Town recently purchased new vests using a matching grant, according to the Chief, the donated plates are constructed using a new technology and will make the vests more comfortable to wear. I will ask to Chief to make sure that these replacement plates do not void any warranties and will not reduce the effectiveness of the Department's vests. This item has been placed under Official Action Items since all gifts to the Town require acceptance by the Board of Selectmen. Mr. Way will be present to make the presentation to Chief Warlick. TOWN OF DAMARISCOTTA WARRANT FOR SPECIAL TOWN MEETING December 19, 2018

LINCOLN, SS

STATE OF MAINE

TO: Jason Warlick, a Constable for the Town of Damariscotta in the County of Lincoln.

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the voters of the Town of Damariscotta, in said County, qualified by law to vote in Town Affairs, to assemble at the Damariscotta Municipal Building on 21 School Street in said Town, on Wednesday the 19th day of December, A.D. 2018 at 5:30 PM., then and there to act on Articles 1 and 2.

ARTICLE 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

ARTICLE 2. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$90,000 from the Town's unappropriated surplus, also referred to as the unassigned fund balance, to be used towards the cost of construction of a downtown restroom. If approved, the appropriation will increase the Town's portion of the cost of the project to \$161,000. Funding available for the project includes \$385,200 in private donations and a \$17,300 grant from the Maine Small Harbor Improvement Program. Project expenses are higher than the cost for construction on a Town-owned site due to the cost of purchasing the barbershop property and substandard soils and the cost of foundation work required for construction in the 1 percent flood zone. The Town's unaudited estimated unassigned fund balance as of June 30, 2018 is \$1,188,000.

Cemetery Deed

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS that the Town of Damariscotta, in the County of Lincoln and the State of Maine, a municipal corporation organized and existing under the laws of the said State, in consideration of the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) paid by Ronald H. Ramsay, in the state of Maine, does hereby transfer and convey unto the said Ronald H. Ramsay and his/her assigns, a certain lot of land in Hillside Cemetery in said Town of Damariscotta, said lot(s) being numbered #1017 (Annex 2) as shown on the plan of the cemetery on file with the Trustees of said cemetery.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same unto the grantee(s) and assigns forever:

ON CONDITION that the same shall be used and improved only as and for a burial lot for the human dead; that no permanent markers shall be erected above the surface of the ground (this does not apply to monuments); no shrubbery or trees shall be planted on the lot; the lot shall not be mounted or terraced, grade to be maintained on level with the rest of area; that it shall not be sold or transferred without leave had and obtained in writing from the trustees of said cemetery; that the owners and possessors thereof shall always be subject to such regulations and orders as are or shall be made for the use and improvement of said cemetery.

And the said Town of Damariscotta covenants to and with the Ronald H. Ramsay and his/her assigns that it is lawfully seized in fee of the aforesaid premises, that the granted premises are free from all encumbrances, that it has good right to sell and convey the same to the said Ronald H. Ramsay and his/her assigns forever.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, the Town of Damariscotta has caused these present to be signed and sealed by its Selectmen, thereunto duly authorized this 19th day of December, 2018.
