# Town Manager Notes for October 20, 2021 Board of Selectmen's Meeting

#### **Presentations**

**CLC Ambulance Review of Preliminary Proposed Budget** -Nick Bryant form Central Lincoln County Ambulance Service will review the organization's proposed FY22 Budget Request. A copy of the preliminary request is attached. I have asked Nick to provide wage survey data for EMT and Paramedic positions and updated information on municipal contributions for ambulance service in the region.

**Parade of Lights and Holiday Display-**John Roberts will provide details on the Chamber of Commerce's plans for this year's Parade of Lights and the Christmas tree displays.

## **Town Manager Items:**

**Board Direction on Infrastructure Bond Issue-** In the current annual workplan, the Board has given a high priority to pursuing a bond issue to provide for major infrastructure projects. I would like to obtain board direction on the process for identifying the projects that would be included and the next steps in developing the project scope, project estimates and financing. As a starting point, I have attached the Public Works Committee's most recent assessment of infrastructure needs.

#### Official Action Items:

Agreement with Maine Department of Transportation re: Information Bureau Property (tentative) – Board action on this item is dependent on our receiving a draft agreement from the Maine Department of Transportation in time for Wednesday's meeting. Jim Gallagher has already drafted a lease agreement for the Town and Chamber once we have the property transfer agreement form the State. Jim did this work for us at no charge.

**Provider Agency Budget Request Process** – As the Board will recall, due to the pandemic, provider agencies were not required to submit petitions to request funding for their organizations

as part of the 2021 Town Meeting Warrant. This opportunity was afforded only to organizations who had received funding in the prior year and the funding request could not exceed the previous year's approved amount. Most of these organizations typically set up tables outside of Town Hall on election day to ask for voter signatures. I am asking the Board to decide whether or not the petition process should be resumed for these requests for the FY2022 Budget.

**Comprehensive Plan Committee Appointments**—I will have a list of recommended Committee appointees for you to consider Wednesday evening.

**Contracts for Fuel Oil and Propane** – I have asked Matt Poole at Colby and Gale to provide contracts for municipal energy needs for the coming year. In past years, the company has provided very favorable rates to the Town.

**Selectmen's Discussion Items** - Selectmen Abbotoni may want to provide an update on the Lincoln County budget process.

Workshop with Bob Faunce re: Planning Update and Recommendations for Ordinance Amendments – As I indicated at the last Board meeting, there are a number of ordinances amendments that have either been approved or are being considered by the Planning Board. The Selectmen have received all of this information as part of the Planning Board packets that you are sent. I believe that will be timely for Bob to highlight some of the more significant recommended changes for both the benefit of the Board of Selectmen and the citizens who will be viewing Wednesday's meeting.

Workshop with Police Chief Jason Warlick re: Officer Recruitment and Retention- Chief Warlick has requested this meeting to review concerns that he and other chiefs have regarding the recruitment and retention of qualified officers.
